

## **PSA AND SPSF (SA BRANCH) MAY COUNCIL MEETINGS**

The PSA and SPSF (SA Branch) Councils met on Monday 28 May. Highlights from the meetings included:

### **GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT**

In addition to standard issues reported upon such as legislation, Agency related matters and outstanding non-Parity EB matters, the General Secretary reported that PSA, in conjunction with SA Unions, was supporting the placement of a billboard at Football Park promoting the ACTU Your Rights at Work campaign. The billboard will remain at the oval until the end of the football season.

Council resolved the following:

### **WORKCHOICES ENQUIRY**

That Council notes that many members and their families have been disadvantaged through the introduction of WorkChoices by the Federal Government,

recognises the protections introduced by the State Government, and

supports the making of a submission to the WorkChoices Inquiry of the SA Industrial Relations Commission which identifies the ongoing harm to members employment arrangements caused by WorkChoices.

### **SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE POLICY**

That the PSA recognises the importance that decisions of Governments, corporations and individuals can have on the well being of the planet and its population,

notes that socially irresponsible investment decisions can have adverse financial repercussions, and

declares its support for socially responsible investment policies being a relevant part of decision making as a sound management principle.

### **APPOINTMENT**

Council appointed Peter Reilly (ASO Land Titles Office) to fill the casual vacancy on Council following the resignation/retirement of Lynn Bryant.
